

Modules

Modules are used to organize course content by weeks, units, or a different organizational structure that works for your course. With modules, you are essentially creating a one-directional linear flow of what you would like your students to do.

It is similar to “Lessons” in OWL Space.

What can you put in modules?

- Assignment
- Quiz
- File
- Content Page
- Discussion
- Text Header
- External URL
- External Tool

Module Settings

- You can attach dates to “lock” from viewing.
- You can add requirements.
 - Students must complete all of these requirements
 - Students must move through requirements in sequential order.
 - Student must complete one of these requirements.
- Once the requirement is set, the target module can have prerequisite settings.

As you create Modules, you can keep them in the draft stage. (see if publish button is green or not. If it is green, your modules are viewable by students unless lock dates are established.)



Caution: When placing content in Modules, make sure those content are published. For example, if you are putting a Page in Modules, make sure that the Page is published. If you have a file inside of the page, make sure that the file is published.

Adding modules

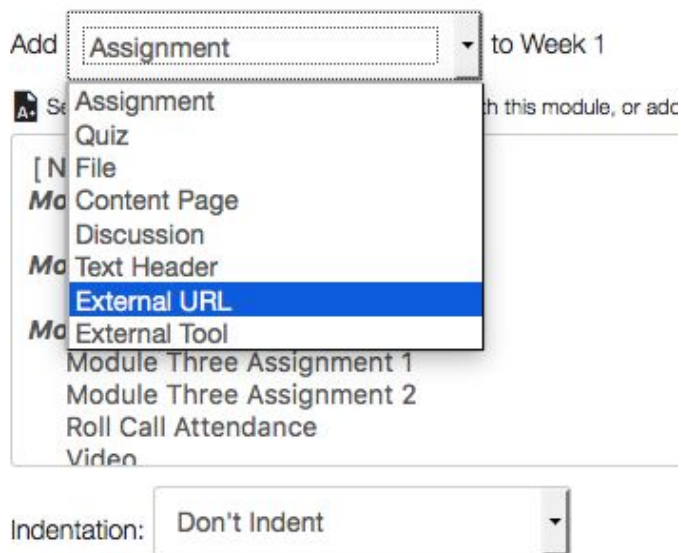


1. Click on the +Module button.
2. Type module name, such as Week 1.
 - a. Use “Lock Until” to keep the module hidden from students.
 - b. Use prerequisite feature to place requirements.
3. To add content to your module, click + button inline with the module you created during step 1 and 2.



4. Let's add an URL. Put your favorite URL, such as CNN.

5. As you can tell, you need some content before you can set up your modules.
 - a. If you don't have any assignment, add an assignment “Week 1 Assignment I” and “Week 1 Assignment II.”
6. Add “Week 1 Assignment I” and “Week 1 Assignment II” to your module.

7. Click on the configuration wheel inline with your module, “Week 1.” Now you can set up requirements.
